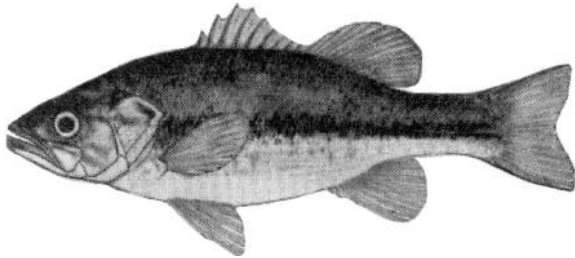

In the year of sale, \$50 goes to the LDWF to fund operations with the balance going into the Louisiana Lifetime Endowment Fund. Available are special value licenses for those under 14 years of age. Lifetime licenses make perfect gifts for a sportsman of any age.

Lifetime Hunting and Fishing Licenses

Effective January 1, 1992, Louisiana residents were eligible for lifetime hunting, lifetime fishing and lifetime combination hunting/fishing licenses. Nonresident licenses are also available.

Lifetime licenses are valid anywhere in the state. If you buy a lifetime license and later move out of state, your license will remain valid any time you return to Louisiana to hunt and/or fish.

Sportsmen must have their lifetime license in their possession while hunting and/or fishing. They must also have a second form of identification, either a driver's license or some other form of photo I.D.

Lifetime licenses for hunting and/or fishing encompass all recreational privileges currently covered by the basic licenses. In addition, the lifetime license covers big game hunting, bow hunting, muzzle-loader hunting, turkey hunting, state waterfowl stamp, as well as saltwater fishing; however, your federal duck stamp is **not** included and must be purchased separately.

Special value combination licenses are available for children under age fourteen.



Purchasing a lifetime license for a child is a wise investment...fees are bound to increase during a youngster's lifetime.

Lifetime licenses are made of durable plastic and available in seven types. A complete listing of the licenses and costs appear on the reverse side. **If you lose your lifetime license, the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries will replace it for a fee of \$7.50. Only replacement requests made in writing, signed and notarized, will be processed.**

Along with your license, you will receive a certificate acknowledging your investment, and a distinctive window decal.

Proof of Residency

Resident lifetime license applicants must prove that they have been domiciled in the state of Louisiana for a minimum of 12 months prior to making application for any lifetime license. **A Louisiana driver's license is REQUIRED AND ANY ONE of the following: a) voters registration card, b) Louisiana vehicle registration, c) Louisiana state income tax return. (Must provide income tax return of previous year in which**

application is made.) In the case of minors (applicants under 18 years of age), domicile of the parents shall be used as evidence of the child's domicile.

For youth licenses, complete applications must be postmarked prior to the fourteenth year birth date, where relevant, to qualify for a youth license.

Hunter Education Requirements

Anyone born on or after September 1, 1969, is required to successfully complete a hunter education course before obtaining a hunting license of any kind in Louisiana. A lifetime license will be issued to any person who has completed the Hunter Education course and has been certified; however, a temporary lifetime license certificate will be issued to any child who has not completed the Hunter Education course, or who is not of certifiable age. (Certifiable age is age 10 and over.) Upon completion of the Hunter Education course, a valid lifetime license showing the certificate number will be issued to him at that time, free of charge.

Adults will notice that the application for lifetime license calls for a hunter certification number. If you have completed a hunter education class, please provide your certification number, and we will include it on your lifetime license. However, if born before September 1, 1969, hunter education certification is not mandatory and the number is not required for your lifetime license.
